

Clubroom is available the weeks of June 13-17 and August 29-31 and Sept. 1, 2 & 6

Students enrolled at SMS (ages 3 to 10) are welcome to attend Clubroom childcare during our teacher classroom cleanup week in June and/or the preparation and training week in August. Children will do a wide variety of activities, games, and projects. The schedule for Clubroom time is flexible; use just what you need. Early Birds (7-9AM): Indoor activities. \$12/hour or \$200/month prepaid unlimited
After School Club (3:15-6:15 PM): Indoor and outdoor activities. \$12/hour or \$335 prepaid unlimited.
Daytime Clubroom (9 AM-3:15 PM). \$12 per hour (available June 13-17, August 29-31, and Sept. 1, 2, 6.)

Summer School registration fees and payment schedule:

The \$65 registration fee and payment for the first two classes you register for is due upon registration. Any remaining balance of payment is due on June 1st for classes that begin in June and for June unlimited After School Club. Any remaining balance is due on July 1st for classes that begin in July and for July unlimited After School Club. Any remaining balance is due on August 1st for classes that begin in August and for August unlimited After School Club. Hourly Clubroom time is billed at the end of the month.

Lunchtime (11:30 AM to 12:45 PM)

Students who attend all day attend the lunch period free of charge. If your child attends either AM or PM class only, you may request to add the lunchtime period. The charge is \$12 per hour. Parents provide a lunch or may order in advance from www.fantazimo.com.

Montessori (ages 3 to 6): \$285/class (prorated to \$256 for session 2)

New students will find this two-week class to be a great head start for the coming school year. Returning students will enjoy continuing to practice the academic and social skills they've learned during the year as well as finding new challenges and meeting new friends. Taught by our own Montessori teachers, it is a relaxed way for new students to become comfortable with school and be away from mom and dad, possibly for the first time. This is an ideal class for children ages 3 to 6. Children must be potty trained and be 3 years old prior to class.

Discovery Units (ages 4 to 10): \$295/class (prorated to \$265.50 for session 2)

Offered to children ages 4 to 10. Children must turn 4 prior to attending a Discovery class. These hands-on two-week classes are a fun way to spend the summer. Morning classes are from 9:00 to 11:30 AM and afternoon classes are from 12:45 to 3:15 PM. Please see the following pages for descriptions of each class.

Elementary Math/Science Camp (grades 1-6): \$300 including lab fees

Offered mornings from 9:00 to 11:30 AM session 3 (July 18-29) and tailored for students entering grades 1-6.

Session 1 Discovery Unit Classes (Ages 4 to 10):

Discovering Science Otter/Koenig Mornings June 20 through July 1

We will launch into our discovery of Science through chemistry, learn what are acids and bases, create a chemical reaction by mixing them, and discover, safely, that a chemical reaction can even be powerful enough to fly a rocket. Acid and bases are also present in our bodies and in the food we eat. Acids in our stomach help to break down food, which will pass onto the small intestine where the nutrients will be absorbed into our body. Bases such as soap kill germs, which helps to keep our body healthy. We will explore the chemistry of food and learn through experiments how important it is to ingest healthy food that will help our bodies to remain strong and healthy. By tasting different foods, we will all be in awe that healthy food indeed tastes very good.

Our science camp would not be complete without our fluorescent *gack* and diverse glowing experiments.

A wide range of shelf activities and easy experiments will support our scientists' natural curiosity and desire for independent exploration.

Elementary Math & Science Camp Ang/Young Mornings July 18 through July 29

Please join us for a two-week immersion of math and science. This class is tailored for students that are entering grades 1 to 6, organized into age groups for projects. We will work on elementary physics, biology, and environmental science introducing the application of mathematical tools to understanding the fundamental concept of each science topic. Many of these tools include challenging levels of mathematical thinking and applications. In mathematics for grades 4-6 we will be introducing pre-algebra concepts and will manipulate physical objects to help understand and apply them to tangible applications.

Session 4 Discovery Unit Classes (Ages 4 to 10):

Pets Galore Burden Mornings August 1 through August 12

If you love animal friends then this is the class for you! Each day new animals will be visiting the class -- gerbils, birds, frogs, fish, rabbits, guinea pigs, etc. On the last day of class we will hold a pet show. Parents are asked to attend the pet show to help hold the larger live pets. We will learn facts about the pet of the day, sing songs, read stories, and do arts and craft projects relating to each pet. A special visitor will come to school to give rides. Details and a participation waiver will be sent home the second day of class and a small additional field trip fee will be charged to cover the horse/pony visit.
